You need two doses of the Covid-19 vaccination for the best protection.

If it's been eight weeks or more since your first jab, you can get your second booked in. Call 01204 462125/462157/462030/462028. Phone lines open Monday to Friday 8.30am to 5.30pm and are for Bolton callers only.
